I guess he's got a problem. A broken fuel pipe perhaps?

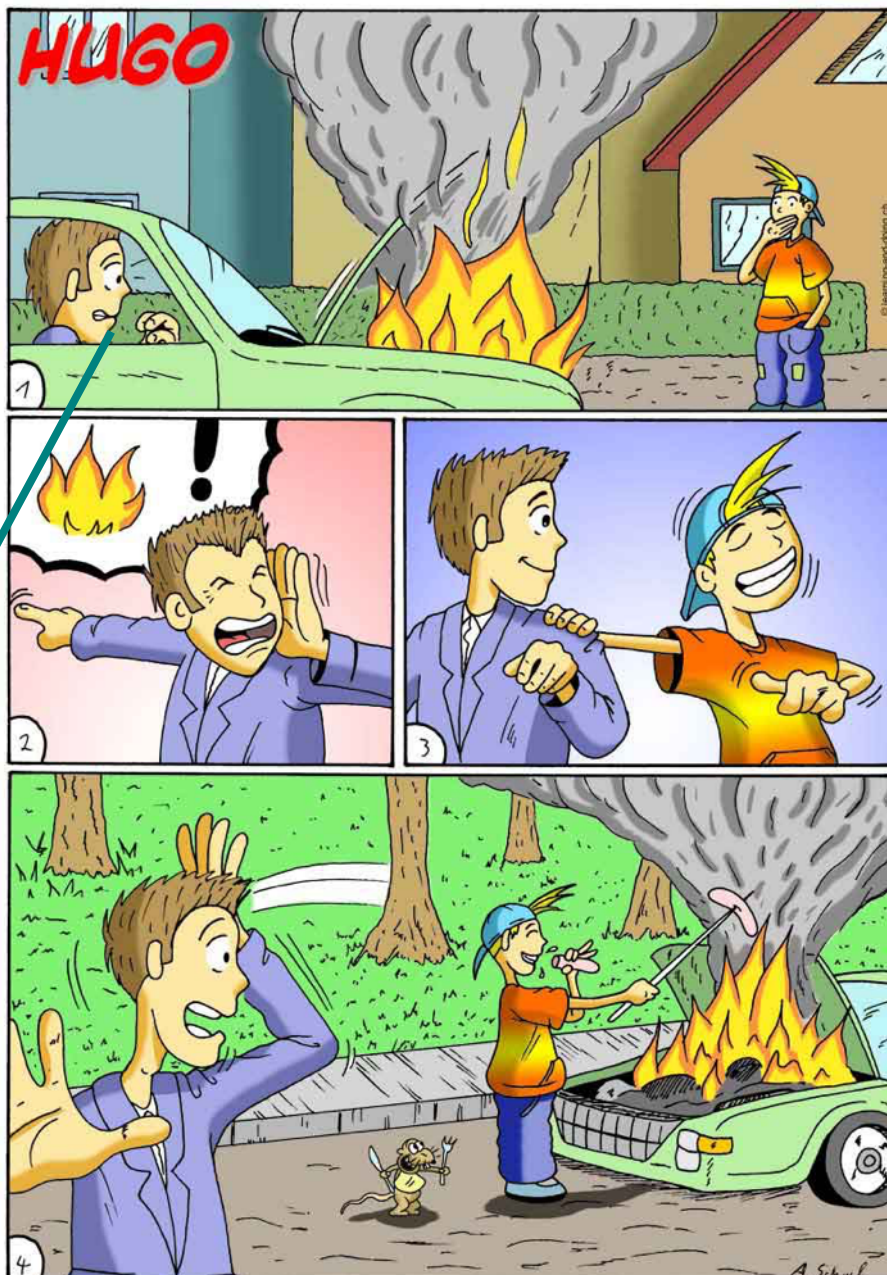
A grilled sausage is an excellent meal. Well, there might be a little taste of petrol.
