I've got a husband and three wonderful children. I've got a lot of friends. I think life is great. I've got everything.



My name is Bob Balden. I'm from Leeds. I'm a poor man. I haven't got any money. I haven't got a job or a house or a car. I haven't got a wife, and I haven't got any children. I haven't got any friends. My life is terrible. I haven't got anything.

*NOTE: to have got = to have
He hasn't got any friends =
He has no friends.*

He's an engineer. (He is engineer.)



Look at this man. His name is Brian Brown. He's from Oxford. He's an engineer. He's got a good job. He's got a small car. He hasn't got a big house. He lives in a flat. He's got a wife, but he hasn't got any children. His life is O.K.

I ...*live*... in Berlin.

You in a modern house.

He ...*lives*... abroad.

She in San Francisco.

We in Denmark.

You in a nice town.

They at Baker Street.

I ...*haven't*... got a car.

You got a bad job.

He got many friends.

She*hasn't*... got anything.

We got any children.

You got any money.

They got a big house.

(American English: I don't have any kids. She doesn't have a good job.)
